PM Modi Announces Rs 6,000 MSP For Soybean: Vidarbha, Marathwada Farmers Relieved

Providing relief to farmers in poll-bound Maharashtra's Vidarbha and Marathwada amid their struggle with fluctuating market rates and adverse conditions, Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared a minimum support price (MSP) of Rs 6,000 per quintal for soybean, a key cash crop, as primary green ahead of Diwali, as it provides farmers with immediate liquidity during the festive season. The Vidarbha and Marathwada regions are particularly significant for soybean cultivation, with districts such as Washim, Buldhana, Akola, Amravati, Yavatmal, Warananagar, Chandrapur, and Bhandara leading the production. Experts estimate that West Vidarbha alone annually produces soybean worth over Rs 7,100 crore. Earlier, the Maharashtra government had announced a financial aid of Rs 5,000 for distressed farmers to mitigate their losses. Deputy chief minister Devendra Fadnis had also introduced the Bhavantar Yojana, a scheme ensuring farmers receive the price difference between the MSP and lower market rates directly in their bank accounts. While these measures had helped, the Prime Minister's



announcement of Rs 6,000 MSP has led to optimism among soybean farmers. The rural economy in Maharashtra heavily depends on soybean trading, particularly during and after the Diwali season. The increased MSP is expected to strengthen this cycle, ensuring better returns for farmers. A soybean farmer from Buldhana district said, "This announcement has brought financial relief to us during the festive season. It gives us hope for a better future." The combination of state-level schemes such as Bhavantar and the new MSP has rejuvenated both farmers and traders. The announcement has also raised expectations of higher open market prices for soybean. Traders are now recalibrating their plans to align with the government's interventions.

'Marathi Manoo's' Kharge: Why Congress President Is Main Face Of Party In Poll-Bound State

Maharashtra is close to Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge's heart. And, why not? He speaks fluent Marathi and, in fact, during most of his campaign in the poll-bound state, he has largely spoken the language Kharge was also the Maharashtra in-charge at one point, and not just this, he ensured that the party's foundation day was celebrated in Mumbai when he became the president in 2022. Also, sources said unlike in Marjaria, where he was not too involved in the campaigning, he was keen and insistent on becoming a part of the poll strategy for the western state. So much so that he has held more rallies in the state than other Congress leaders, especially the Kharge, who seem to be willing to let the party chief have his way. He naturally breaks into Marathi even during press conferences, where the state media turns up, and his ease with the language is an added advantage. So, no surprise, that the poll battle here will be remembered as Kharge versus Yogi Adityanath. The rest of the party is comfortable with this. No one else is stepping in to confront Adityanath as they know that the Congress president with his Marathi will be the best man to handle the situation, truly making this his moment. In past elections, the limelight was on senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi. In fact, the BJP's failure to gain a simple majority in the Lok Sabha elections, and the relatively decent performance by the INDIA bloc was



attributed to Rahul Gandhi. Many felt 'Kharge may have felt like a footnote. But, Maharashtra is Kharge's battleground and the Gandhi do not mind. Like NCP (SP) chief Sharad Pawar and, to a certain extent, Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Uddhav Thackeray, the Congress president enjoys the gravitas, acumen and maturity of a politician. With his vast experience, he is a hard-core. And this state, with which he is familiar, is giving him a chance to emerge on his own. With this comes the responsibility too. A win would add to his stature and he knows it. Which is why Kharge's campaigning is aggressive, taking on the Uttar Pradesh chief minister, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, and even Prime Minister Narendra Modi. His speeches are provocative as well, showing that he is not nervous. The Marathi cap of the Gandhi topi, as it is called, sits easy on his head for now.

Ajit Pawar Objects To 'Batenge Toh Katenge' Slogan, Fadnis Sends Him A Rejoinder

Ahead of the Maharashtra assembly elections, "Batenge toh katenge," a slogan coined by Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, has become a major point of contention among Mahayuti partners, with the NCP opposing it. Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister and BJP leader Devendra Fadnis on Friday responded to his colleague in the state cabinet and NCP leader Ajit Pawar's opposition over the slogan, saying that people who have stayed with "anti-Hindutva" ideology will take time to comprehend public sentiment. Pawar had remarked that there is no place for the "batenge toh katenge" slogan in Maharashtra as the state works on the principles of BR Ambedkar, upholding his ally BJP ahead of the crucial Maharashtra assembly election. Responding to Pawar's remark, Fadnis said, "For decades, Ajit Pawar stayed with such ideologies which are secular and anti-Hindu. There is no real secularism amongst those who call themselves secularists. He has stayed with people for whom opposing Hinduism is secular. It will take some time for him to understand the mood of the public. Clarifying that "batenge to katenge" means everyone has to stick together, Fadnis said, "These people either did not understand the sentiment of this public or did not understand the meaning of this statement or while speaking they probably wanted to say something else." "Not Supporting It": Ajit Pawar, the nephew of Sharad Pawar - maintained his stand over the "batenge toh katenge" slogan, saying



that he would not support such ideas. "We all have opposed it. Someone told me that BJP's Pankaj Munde has also opposed this slogan. A CM of a state comes here and says 'batenge toh katenge', immediately we said such slogans will not work here as Maharashtra works on the principles of Ambedkar. I don't know what is Devendra's answer to this," Pawar was quoted. "Not just ally NCP, but some of the high-profile Maharashtra BJP leaders have also maintained distance from the slogan, stating that the party must avoid divisive rhetoric. The "batenge toh katenge" slogan was first raised by UP CM and the BJP's star campaigner Yogi Adityanath at one of his recent rallies in Maharashtra which was later criticised by the opposition who alleged communal overtones in the slogan. Notably, Prime Minister Narendra Modi tweaked the slogan earlier this month to "ekathak sahi hai", in a message of unity.

Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde exuded confidence that his alliance "Mahayuti" is headed for a big win in the Maharashtra Assembly election while blaming "lies" peddled by the opposition for the setback during Lok Sabha polls. In an exclusive interview with CNN, Shinde said his government gave 10% reservation to Marathas but the opposition is attempting to have this overturned in court. "They consistently spread lies during Lok Sabha. They misled people about the Constitution, but now people see the truth," he said. The MVA secured 21 of the 48 Lok Sabha seats in Maharashtra while the NDA won only 17 seats. Shinde claimed that opposition leaders approached the court to stop his government's "Ladki Bahin Yojana" under which eligible women receive Rs 1,500 per month in financial assistance. The Mahayuti has promised to increase this amount to Rs 2,100 once they return to power. "They accused us of handing out freebies, yet they are now copying our initiatives. In many states, they have made promises for schemes that turned out to be empty. This behaviour is an insult to our Ladki Bahin," he said. Shinde said he has visited many districts across Maharashtra and he is sensing a positive atmosphere everywhere



for Mahayuti. "For me, 'CM' doesn't just stand for Chief Minister; it stands for Common Man. I even met with their people at 3 a.m. to better understand their issues," he said. The Mahayuti and the opposition MahaVikasAghadi, are locked in a close fight for electoral supremacy in Maharashtra which will go to polls on November 20. The counting of votes will take place on November 22. Of the ruling Mahayuti alliance, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has fielded 149 candidates. Chief Minister Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena has fielded 81 candidates, and deputy CM Ajit Pawar-led NCP has fielded 59. The Opposition MahaVikasAghadi, the Congress has fielded 101 candidates. Shiv Sena (UBT) led by Uddhav Thackeray has 95 candidates in the fray and NCP (Shivachandana Pawar) has 86 candidates. In some constituencies, there would be hardy fights between allies.

'Distasteful Remarks By Troll Army': Fadnis Slams Kanhaiya Kumar's 'Reels' Jibe At Wife Amruta

Maharashtra deputy Chief Minister and BJP leader Devendra Fadnis sharply hit out at Congress leader Kanhaiya Kumar over his derogatory remarks on Fadnis' wife making reels saying that Kumar should be highly ashamed of himself. Fadnis said that he was not surprised by such remarks as he and his wife have been tolerating such comments for five years. "Sharam aani chahiye, chulu bhar panni maini stamb maara chahiye" (he should be ashamed, should die in a handful of water)... I am not surprised by this. My wife and I have suffered for the last 5 years. The hate campaign that the MohiVikasAghadi has launched against me is nothing new. I have been the Home Minister for

the past 2.5 years and I know who's running which campaign," Fadnis said. The deputy CM further accused the Uddhav Thackeray-led Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government of deploying investigative agencies and trapping him in false cases. He said then when they didn't find anything, they started making comments against his wife. "They could not find anything against me, they deployed all the agencies against me. They investigated everything from my hair to my blood but did not find anything against me. When they did not find anything, they started personal attacks on me. Their troll army makes allegations against my wife but I told my wife that we are in politics and we have to keep patience. They only wanted to defeat Devendra Fadnis. But I gained from this due to my track record," he



added. The Congress leader stoked a controversy after he took a dig at Fadnis couple saying that why his public should be responsible for "savouring religion" while the Deputy Chief Minister's

wife makes Instagram reels. He said that the responsibility of protecting the religion should rest upon everyone and not just the general public. Addressing a rally in Nagpur ahead of the Maharashtra election, Kanhaiya Kumar also took aim at Amruta Fadnis, the wife of the BJP leader. Amruta Fadnis, a trained classical singer and a banker, is active on social media. "If this is a 'bhama yuthi' (religious war), then question any leader who gives you speeches about saving religion. Ask them if the leader's own sons and daughters will also join in the fight to save religion. How is it possible that the public saves religion while the leader's children study abroad? How can the public be responsible for saving religion, while the Deputy Chief Minister's wife makes Instagram reels?" Kumar had said.
